

In the sure and certain hope of the resurrection, this service is a celebration of life, even as we grieve all that we have lost. It is a service of scripture and prayer and of joining with the whole communion of saints as we celebrate the life of Loren Williams. We will be using two books during this liturgy which you will find in the pew rack in front of your seat or on your pew—**The Book of Common Prayer and The Hymnal 1982**. Please join in the service by joining in the responses highlighted in bold print.

#### The service begins with the following anthem. Please stand.

I am Resurrection and I am Life, says the Lord. Whoever has faith in me shall have life, even though he die. And everyone who has life, and has committed himself to me in faith, shall not die for ever. As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives and that at the last he will stand upon the earth. After my awaking, he will raise me up; and in my body I shall see God. I myself shall see, and my eyes behold him who is my friend and not a stranger. For none of us has life in himself, and none becomes his own master when he dies. For if we have life, we are alive in the Lord, and if we die, we die in the Lord. So, then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's possession. Happy from now on are those who die in the Lord! So it is, says the Spirit, for they rest from their labors.

The Celebrant then says The Lord be with you. People And also with you. Celebrant Let us pray.

O God who by the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ destroyed death, and brought life and immortality to light: Grant that your servant Wyman Loren Williams, Jr., being raised by him, may know the strength of his presence, and rejoice in his eternal glory; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.* 

Most merciful God, whose wisdom is beyond our understanding: Deal graciously with Sarah, Loren, Steve, and David, Susan, Helen, and Sarah, Kate, Sam, Sally, Aaron, and Robert, and all gathered here in their grief. Surround them with your love, that they may not be overwhelmed by their loss, but have confidence in your goodness, and strength to meet the days to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.* 

God our Comforter, you are a refuge and a strength for us, a helper close at hand in times of distress. Help us so to hear the words of our faith that our fear is dispelled, our loneliness eased, and our hope reawakened. May your Holy Spirit lift us above our natural sorrow, to the peace and light of your constant love; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.* 


#### **Lessons from Scripture**

### A Reading from II Corinthians 4:16-5:9

We do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory beyond all measure, because we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen; for what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal.


For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.
